Hayes: photographs ca.1920: natives at singsing wearing pearl-shell and pig tusks, with septum piercings and white cockatoo feathers in hair; thirteen men wearing pig tusks and boat-shaped white cockatoo head-dresses carrying *kundus* (drums) and woven *bilums* (string bags); plantation scene with manager's house behind well laid-out garden. *Following mainly of Eitape/Aitape, Sepik District:* footbridge across river with scattered European-style houses; Eitape beach with Catholic Mission vessel "Gabriel" at anchor; German-built plantation bungalow; ?Eitape station showing ?District Office, more bungalows and ?storage/copra processing shed; pitsawing a log; group of natives in singsing finery – with (?Australian Army) Rising Sun on helmet; pre-1921 labour line; European (unidentified) has (?Australian Army) Rising Sun on slouch hat. *Identified and dated photographs:* men of Atzera village, Huon Gulf, wearing coloured hats of beaten bark; lagoon near Markham River; village of Labu at mouth of Markham River; Singaua plantation, Huon Gulf; native climbing Areca palm tree for betel-nuts. These photographs dated 040220 – 210320.

Charles Betteridge by email: story of the battle of Driniumor River, Aitape area, 10/11 July – 25 August 1944; 3,000 Americans and 8,000 – 10,000 Japanese killed. Nearby creeks clogged with Japanese bodies which polluted village drinking water for some weeks. Story put in Fryer e-space.
