HEADHUNT REVISITED is a documentary film about the power of Caroline Mytinger's art to span oceans and decades. The film retraces her and friend, Margaret Warner's improbable journey to Melanesia-then known as the land of headhunters-in the 1920's on a quest to find and paint portraits of unspoiled civilizations. Their journey was nothing short of amazing and, at times, fraught with danger. Mosquitoes engorged with blood had to be snipped off with scissors; cockroaches the size of hummingbirds chewed on their toes; and a volcanic eruption threatened the very existence of the artwork. Yet after all the difficulties, Caroline returned with 25 oil paintings, over 40 sketches, numerous notes and ephemera and proceeded to publish two books about the experience.



Through Siaka's Eyes -Jeffry Feeger

More than eighty years later, American photographer, Michele Westmorland set out to retrace Caroline and Margaret's footsteps. Michele then introduces the historic paintings to Jeffry Feeger, a contemporary artist from Papua New Guinea. His artwork and voice brings the legacy and story of Caroline Mytinger full circle.
